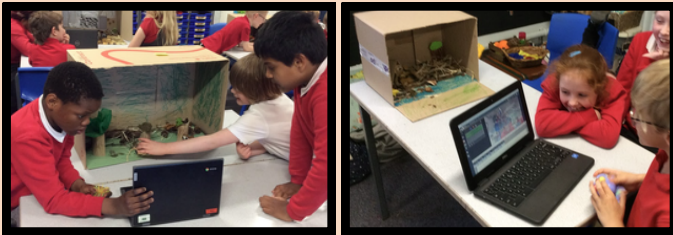

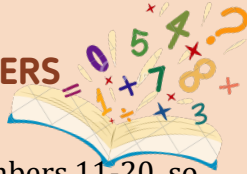
Around school this week!
